Custodial history: donated in 2012. An accrual was later donated to the Museum in 2023.

Scope and content:

The fonds reflects Lehmann's research on Canadian railway development and its sources of locomotives. He conducted research on companies that built locomotives in Halifax, Saint John, Montreal, Toronto, and Hamilton, but there is also an entire series of research files on the succession of companies in Kingston, including particularly the Canadian Locomotive Company. The fonds is arranged into the following nine series: LEH-1) Articles and Talks (1965-1994); LEH-2) Canadian Locomotive Builders Project (1969-1994) on his book project; LEH-3) Canadian Locomotive Builders (1824-1990) LEH-4) Canadian Railway Shops (1859-1900); LEH-5) Canadian Locomotive Co. (1845-1991); LEH-6) Miscellaneous reference files (1858-1985); LEH-7) Locomotives and Railways, Articles and Books (1876-2000); LEH-8) Photos and Slides (1852-1987); et LEH-9) Additional Material (1884-1999). The last series, LEH-9, includes all the material transferred in the 2023 accrual.

Biography:

Fritz Lehmann was born in 1936 in Oak Park, Illinois. He received his undergraduate degree at Oberlin College in 1958, and his master's degrees and Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin (1961, 1967). His area of expertise was the history of India and the South Asian region, in particular the role of Islam in the region, technology and its relation to the region's culture and development, and Urdu language and literature.

He joined the University of British Columbia's Department of History in 1967, where he was a member of the faculty until his death in 1994.

Throughout his life Lehmann was a lover of railways, especially steam locomotives. Wherever he went, he sought out, photographed and studied railways. In the late 1970s he became aware that very little was known about the locomotive construction industry in Canada. He decided to write a book about this subject and started writing articles on various individual manufacturers. He also collected material on Canadian railways on the macro level. He worked diligently on this project on his own time. However a stroke in 1988 slowed work down and his book remained incomplete at the time of his death.

Related Materials:

Lehmann's archives can mainly be found at the University of British Columbia Archives where his fonds covers his university teaching and research. The Canada Museum of Science and Technology fonds contains his research on Canadian railways and locomotive building.

Portée et contenu :

Le fonds reflète la recherche que Lehmann a effectuée sur le développement du réseau ferroviaire canadien et sur les origines et la fabrication des locomotives. Il a fait des recherches sur les sociétés qui fabriquaient des locomotives à Halifax, à Saint John, à Montréal, à Toronto et à Hamilton, et a monté une série entière de dossiers sur la succession d'entreprises à Kingston, plus particulièrement sur la Canadian Locomotive Company. Le fonds de recherche se compose de neuf séries : LEH-1) articles et conférences (1965-1994); LEH-2) projet sur les fabricants canadiens de locomotives (rédaction d'un livre, 1969-1994); LEH-3) fabricants canadiens de locomotives (1824-1991); LEH-4) ateliers ferroviaires canadiens (1859-1900); LEH-5) entreprise Canadian Locomotive Company (1845-1991); LEH-6) divers dossiers de référence (1858-1985); LEH-7) locomotives et chemins de fer (articles et livres, 1876-2000); LEH-8) photographies et diapositives (1852-1987), et LEH-9) Matériel supplémentaire (1884-1999). La série LEH-9, Matériel supplémentaire, contient tout le matériel du versement complémentaire de 2023.

Notice biographique :

Fritz Lehmann est né en 1936 à Oak Park, en Illinois. Il a obtenu son baccalauréat au Oberlin College en 1958 et a fait une maîtrise à l'Université du Wisconsin (1961 et 1967, respectivement). Son domaine de compétence était l'histoire de l'Inde et de la région de

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l'Asie du sud, s'intéressant particulièrement au rôle de l'Islam dans ces régions ainsi qu'à son incidence sur la technologie, la culture et le développement, et à la langue urdu et sa littérature.

Il a intégré le département d'histoire de l'Université de la Colombie-Britannique en 1967, où il a fait partie de la faculté jusqu'à son décès, en 1994.

Tout au long de sa vie, Lehmann s'est passionné pour les chemins de fers, et surtout pour les locomotives à vapeur. Partout où il allait, il cherchait, photographiait et étudiait les voies ferrées. À la fin des années 1970, il a compris que l'industrie canadienne de la fabrication de locomotives était bien mal connue. Il a donc décidé d'écrire un livre sur le sujet et de rédiger des articles sur les différents fabricants. Il a également accumulé du matériel sur le réseau ferroviaire canadien provenant de la scène mondiale. Il a travaillé assidûment sur ce projet pendant ses temps libres. Toutefois, un accident vasculaire cérébral, en 1988, a ralenti ses travaux, et il n'a jamais pu finir la rédaction de son ouvrage.

Documents connexes :

La majeure partie des archives de Lehmann se trouve aux archives de l'Université de la Colombie Britannique, où le fonds porte sur son enseignement et sa recherche universitaire. Le fonds conservé au Musée des sciences et de la technologie du Canada comprend ses recherches sur le réseau ferroviaire canadien et la fabrication de locomotives.

Series Descriptions

Series 1. Articles and Talks. 1965-1994, 2012, 10 linear cm of textual records, Box 1. Lehmann's published articles on 19th century Canadian locomotive builders and railway superintendents who supervised locomotive construction. Conference papers and unpublished manuscripts on the Canadian Locomotive Co. of Kingston ON, Canada's largest builder of locomotives. Also included are his published articles on Indian locomotives and railways and a few miscellaneous articles and book reviews.

Series 2. Canadian Locomotive Builders Project. 1969-1994, 16 linear cm of textual records, Boxes 1-2.

Files relating to Lehmann's projected book on locomotive building in Canada including funding requests, reference/research files on sources relating to various historical and political aspects of Canadian railway and locomotive development. Correspondence with academic historians, archivists and railway historians in Canada, the US and UK.

Series 3. Canadian Locomotive Builders. 1824-1990, 34.5 linear cm of textual records, Boxes 2-4.

Files containing Lehmann's research on 19th and 20th century companies that built locomotives in Halifax, Saint John, Montreal, Toronto and Hamilton. Includes archival and historical sources, city directories, credit reports, genealogies, lists of locomotives built as well as extensive newspaper research. Sometimes includes draft articles, comments by others and corrections.

Series 4. Canadian Railway Shop Builders. 1859-1990, 7 linear cm of textual records, Boxes 4-5.

Files on railway shops that built locomotives, chiefly the Grand Trunk Railway's Point St. Charles shops in Montreal. Files on Richard Eaton who was mechanical superintendent there. Some files on the Moncton shops of the Intercolonial Railway.

Series 5. Canadian Locomotive Co. 1845-1991, 60 linear cm of textual records, Box 5-8.

Files on the history of Kingston ON, extensive lists of locomotives built by various Kingston companies 1854-1968, detailed notes on Kingston newspapers 1845-1950, files on company owners, superintendents and unions. Notes and interviews with retired CLC employees in 1982 and 1985. Copies of patents taken out by CLC employees 1870-1938. A small number of files on the Montreal Locomotive Works/Bombardier and Beyer, Peacock & Co. *See list of companies covered by the generic name "Canadian Locomotive Co" at the end of this finding aid.

Series 6. Miscellaneous. 1858-1985, 8 linear cm of textual records, box 8.

Locomotive rosters of various Canadian railways and American locomotive builders, two maintenance manuals for diesel engines and material relating to the Welland Railway, 1858-59.

Series 007. Locomotives and Railways, Articles and Books. 1876-2000, 24 linear cm of

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textual records, Box 8-10.

Photocopies of articles and extracts from books on locomotives, railways and other related subjects, mostly in Canada, the US and UK.

Series 008. Photos and Slides. 1852-1987, 14 linear cm of graphic material, Box 10-11.

Lehmann's correspondence and orders with various archives, museums and individuals to obtain photos of locomotives. Two albums of prints relating to various Canadian locomotives. Lehmann's slides of buildings and sites where locomotives were built.

Series 009. Additional Material. 1884-1999, 15 linear cm of textual material, Box 12.

Additional material relating to Lehmann's work on three Canadian steam locomotive builders which includes draft articles, evaluations and correspondence with editors. Lehmann's 1988 draft article on Acadian Engine Co. of Bridgewater NS, which built small internal combustion engines for inshore fishing boats. Material includes notes and photocopies of documents relating to the company. Documents on Robb Engineering of Amherst NS, a foundry-machine shop that became a producer of Canadian stationary steam engines and boilers. Robb became a wholly-owned subsidiary of Dominion Bridge Co. in 1928. Files contain notes and photocopies of catalogues, company descriptions, agreements, financial documents, patents and history. Other files on Nova Scotia business development 1981, 1987-89, Canadian engineering history, 1985 and sample CP Rail train orders from British Columbia, 1979.
