Hastings County Records in the attic of the former Gaol Governor's Residence: A Preliminary Inventory

based on research by members of the Archives Committee of the Hastings County Historical Society January-May 1993; and September 1996

BACKGROUND

In mid-January 1993, I was notified by the County Clerk's Office that a considerable quantity of old documents was to be disposed of. They were stored in the attic of the former gaol governor's residence and were deemed to be a potential safety/fire threat. The clerk-administrator had viewed the documents and felt some might be of historical significance. After all, this attic was the source of the minute book of the Richardson Gold Mining Company of the 1860s, recovered by an employee of the Ontario Archives a few years ago and known to be a significant document.

I visited the site briefly on January 18, confirmed the potential value of the material, and arranged for a work party to visit the attic on the 22nd. Workers included Lois and Paul Foster, Eg Boyce, and myself. The temperature was cool, the light was dim, and the records were extremely dusty, but the material contained some valuable nuggets. The first day we uncovered printed minute books from the Victoria District in the 1840s, packages of materials submitted to council meetings as early as 1850, and an 1888 agreement between the County and architect/builder John Forin to construct the building in which we were working.

Subsequent work sessions were held on January 26, February 1, March 19, 23, 26, 31, April 1, 8, 16, 17, 30, May 10. On some days, temperatures were extremely low; workers wore coats and gloves. On one occasion, unseasonably high temperatures forced workers to move to the front porch, where wind was a problem. Lois and Paul Foster, Beth Green, and I remained the principal members of the attic gang, assisted by Elizabeth Mitchell, Eg Boyce, and Lewis Zandbergen.

It was apparent that most of the materials had been in the attic for some time. Many of the boxes were in poor condition and the exposed contents were extremely dusty. In view of the origin of many of the boxes (the clerk's office in the 1950s) it would seem likely that clerk Erle S. Denyes had the material moved to the attic after the clerk's office moved from Shire Hall to the present Court House and Administration Building. We are indebted to Erle and other clerks and county officials for preserving this archival material.

The attic materials came from several sources, particularly:

- (1) County Clerk's Office
- (2) County Treasurer's Office
- (3) Home for the Aged
- (4) County Court
- (5) County Gaol
- (6) Children's Aid Society (copies of reports)

Strictly routine financial papers were discarded, as were some overly sensitive materials (such as lists of gaol inmates and indigents). Discarded materials were removed by County staff to be shredded.

In the fall of 1996, members of the (re)search committee (notably Lois Foster, Paul Foster and myself returned to the attic treasure trove. We discovered that the recent construction of the addition to the County Administration Building had not disturbed the archival materials, although there was an additional layer of dust. Members of the team worked (September 18 and 27 and October 1 and 7) to finishing sorting, cataloguing, and storing the collection in dustproof, waterproof containers. These materials should be left in the attic, awaiting a more suitable archival setting in future.

Members of the (re)search committee also identified some materials:

- (1) to be added to the collection of County papers in the Hastings County Historical Society's Collection in the Canadiana Room of the Corby Library ... for example the County Assessment Roll for 1871 would be of value to genealogists ... permission for the relocation will be sought from County officials
- (2) to be placed in the clerk's office ... for example the indexes to the early minute books, since the minute books are in the administrator's vault

Researchers consulting the collection are advised that, wherever possible, the original arrangement of the material has been retained or reconstructed.

BOX numbers refer to storage containers. The number normally refers to the start of material contained in that box.
