Whereas the numbers of adult blind will be appreciably increased by the return to the Province of soldiers blinded in the present war, thus still further complicating the whole question of the adult blind.

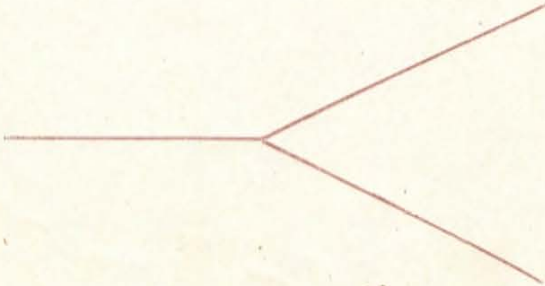
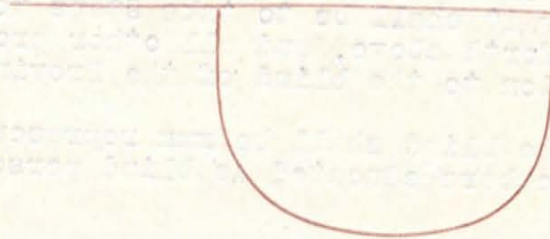
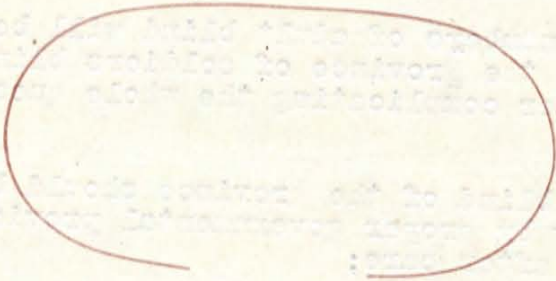
Whereas the blind of the Province should be made an asset rather than a liability by proper governmental provisions for training, employment, and after care;

Whereas the requisite legislation to meet and solve the problems above indicated is wholly lacking in the Province of Ontario, and whereas such legislation is found in full operation in many other States and countries with resulting enormous benefit to the blind and the ratepayer;

Therefore it is resolved:-

That the Government of Ontario be respectfully requested to enact at the forthcoming session of the Assembly the necessary legislation for the creation of a permanent and non-partizan Commission for the Blind, whose duty it shall be to take steps to deal adequately with the matters set forth above, and all other proper questions hereafter arising in relation to the blind of the Province.
