humbly sheweth:

That Municipalities are called upon to annually provide large sums of money for the construction and upkeep of roadways, all of which is directly beneficial to motor vehicle traffic; that one of the revenue derived from licenses issued for motor vehicles is received by the Municipalities, although much of the expense of the construction and upkeep of the roadways is made necessary by such traffic; also that this traffic is largely responsible for the wear and tear of the roadways, the upkeep of which will become more expensive with the increase of motor vehicle traffic over the same.

That Municipalities are required to pay over to the Provincial Treasurer certain fines imposed by Police Magistrates in local Police Courts for offences under the Statutes of the Dominion and Provincial governments, of which the Provincial returns one-half to the Municipalities. That as the expenses of the Police Court, Police Force, Salary of Police Magistrate, Police Patrol Wagons, Police Ambulance and clerical expenses borne by the Municipality, your petitioners deem it expedient that the whole amount of the fines imposed by the Police Magistrate in local Police Courts should be paid over to the Municipality for the uses thereof, except in cases where the prosecution is instituted by an officer of either the Dominion or Provincial Governments.

That as the expenses of the Police Court, Police Force, salary of Police Magistrate, Police Patrol Wagons, Police Ambulance and clerical expenses are borne by the Municipality, your petitioners deem it expedient that the whole amount of the fines and fees imposed by the Police Magistrate in local Police Courts should be paid over to the Municipality for the uses thereof, except in cases where the prosecution is instituted by an officer of either the Dominion or Provincial Governments.

Wherefore your petitioner humbly prays as follows:

That Your Honour may be pleased to sanction the passing of an Act providing that each urban Municipality shall be paid by the Province the amount received from licenses issued to owners of motor vehicles, residing in such urban Municipality, after deducting from such amount the expenses incurred by the Department in issuing said licenses.

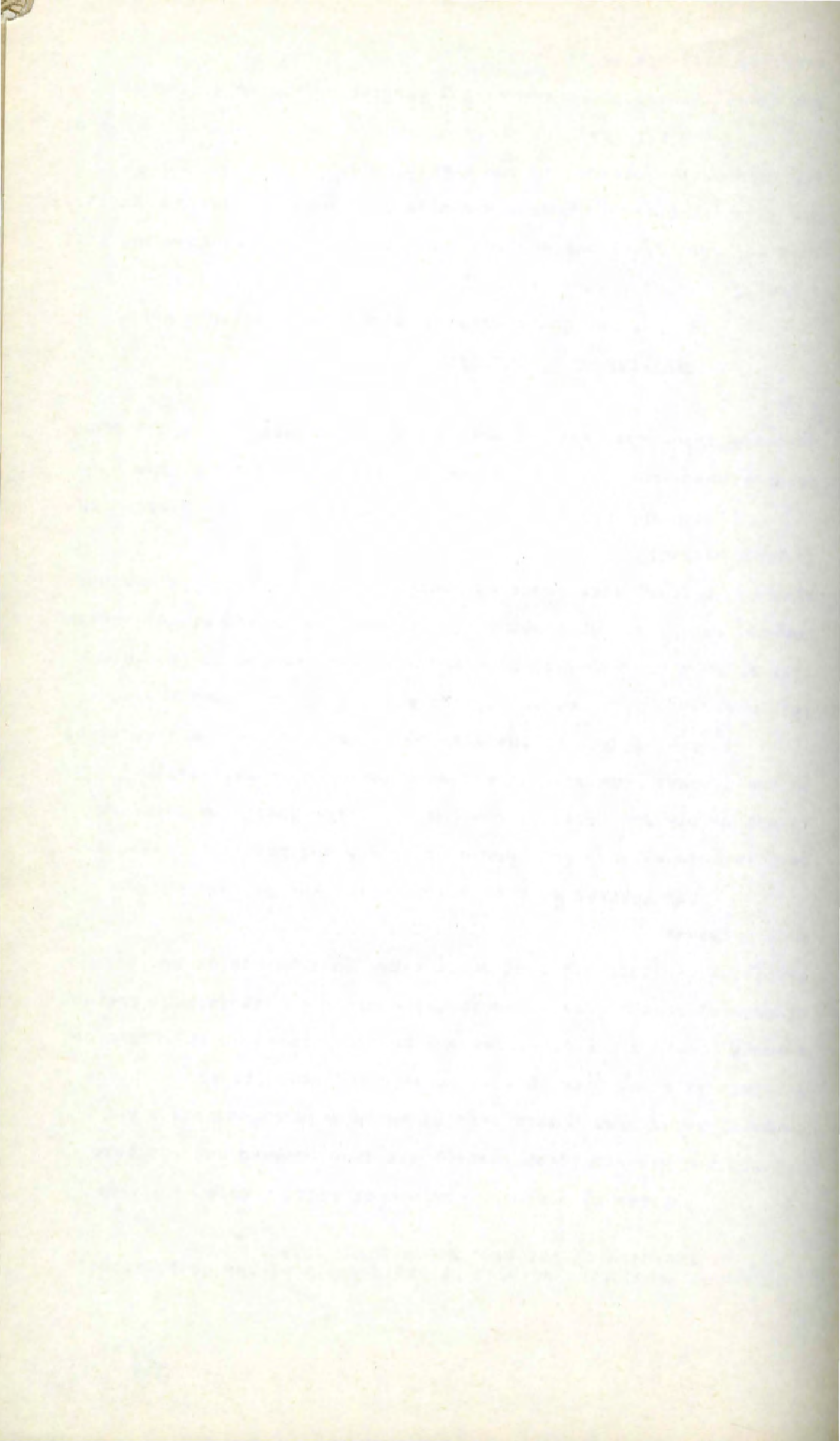
